A sewing machine to help a mum escaping domestic violence start her own small business.

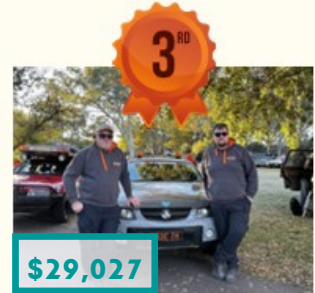
